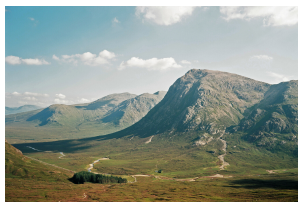

Rolling Acceptance

Applications are reviewed and students are accepted on a rolling basis. Students are expected to pay the \$300 deposit within one week of acceptance.

Course Description

This course aims to introduce students to eighteenth- and nineteenth century Scottish history and culture through the exploration of landscapes and cityscapes, including the Highlands and the city of Edinburgh. Students will explore Scottish political history coupled with movement theory to emphasize the experiential nature of travel. We will explore the importance of recreation and leisure in Scottish culture and our own kinesthetic experience of hiking Arthur's Seat, an iconic hike offering great views of Edinburgh.

Sites and Highlights

Students will visit significant historical sites like Edinburgh Castle and view artifacts at the National Museum of Scotland. Students will also visit Culloden Moor, Clava Cairns, and Castle Urquhart at Loch Ness, as well as the Highland mountains of Glencoe.

*This program includes extensive walking on uneven terrain. Alternate activities can be provided, if needed.
