### **Rolling Acceptance**

Applications are reviewed and students are accepted on a rolling basis. Students are expected to pay the \$300 deposit within one week of acceptance.

### **Course Description**

In this course students learn about the art and culture of Tanzania and East Africa more widely. Students work on a series of written and exhibition-based assignments based on experiences on the tour. Students work as an artist, teacher, curator, and as a community service provider. This is a unique opportunity for students interested in learning about Tanzania through first-hand involvement in the community.

### **Sites and Highlights**

Students will work within a rural community with elementary through college-age students in classroom and recreational settings. Investigate Maasai culture in the semi-arid savannah of Northern Tanzania. Safari in Ngorongoro Crater and see the grand wildlife. Research with a local museum that is preserving the art and culture of East Africa. Climb the base hike of Mt. Kilimanjaro with Colobus monkeys. Tour the streets of Stone Town Zanzibar and swim in the Indian Ocean.
